Reading is the Key! Let Raz-Kids Help

Kindergarten and 1st grades are critical years in a child's education. Students learn to read and build on this foundation throughout the rest of their school years and beyond. Please be sure to spend time with your child each night reading and reviewing letters, sounds or sight words depending on your child's needs.

If you have internet access at home, you can take advantage of a web-based reading program your child is enrolled in here at Donnelsville. In the Raz-Kids program, kids can listen to, read, and take quizzes over books at their reading level. This is a great way to get in extra reading practice and to give kids exposure to good reading.

To access the program, go to <u>www.raz-kids.com</u>.. If your child is in first grade, type in their teacher's last name and donn. For instance, if your child is in Mrs. Rogers class, type in rogersdonn. Kindergarten students are currently being enrolled and you will receive a note with your child's login information in the next few weeks. Once logged in, you'll see a roster of students. Students should select their name. This takes them to a page with books at their level. To listen to the story, click on the ear icon. To read the story, click on the eye icon, and to take a quiz, click on the question mark.

Kids can also go to the bookroom and listen to books at any level. As students listen to, read, and take quizzes, they earn stars that they can "spend" on Raz-Rockets. They are actually just redeeming points they earned for completing books. This can be a real motivator for the kids. Absence Reporting Guidelines

In accordance with the State of Ohio Missing Children's Act, parents are asked to notify their child's school by 10:00 a.m. each day their child will be ABSENT or TARDY. The Tecumseh Education Connection's automated absence line is available to you 24 hours a day to report your child. The TEC number is 845-4483.

If dropping your child off for school, please drop students off at 8:00 am if the child is eating breakfast or at 8:15 for students going to directly to class. The tardy bell rings at 8:30. We have had a large number of students signing in tardy daily. Please give your child the best start to their day by being on time.
